### Building teams that make the church grow Steve and Juliet Barber - Auditorium

Having led and developed two churches Steve and Juliet have spent a great deal of time developing leaders and facilitating church growth. In this seminar they will talk about how to be a leader that builds teams and communities around them, an essential skill to advancing God's Kingdom.

Steve and Juliet lead Leicester City Vineyard Church and also coordinate the VCUKI Church Planting team.

#### Risk taking in leadership Tom Murphy - F1

This seminar will explore how we grow and develop as leaders who are led by the Holy Spirit into taking more risks, so that we can see the Kingdom of God extended in our cities and communities. Tom has been involved in developing a number of different ministry areas at Trent over the past sixteen years. He will share some personal experiences of the highs and lows of taking risks in ministry, as well as looking into the biblical and theological impetus for taking risks.

Tom is senior associate pastor at Trent Vineyard.

#### Dying well John Wyatt – <mark>G4</mark>

Tragic media stories about people who wish to kill themselves, and debates about euthanasia and doctor assisted suicide have become common on our televisions and in newspapers. At the same time many Christians face silent fears about their own mortality or have watched loved ones struggling with dementia, disability and terminal conditions. What does it mean to die well and to die faithfully as a Christian believer?

John Wyatt is Emeritus Professor of Neonatal Paediatrics at University College London, and a frequent speaker on medical and ethical issues in both secular and Christian contexts.

#### International missions Jon Franklin and Andrew Myatt - Y7

This seminar will be looking at the Vineyard approach to mission and the five core values which serve as our foundation for international ministry. An essential guide for anyone already involved in or looking to get their church involved in international cross cultural church planting.

Jon Franklin and Andrew Myatt run the VCUKI Missions Task Force and have many years experience of local church based mission as well as Vineyard Partnerships.

Mental health issues remain one of the great taboos for church leaders and for Christian doctors alike. Yet many of us struggle silently and alone with depression, anxiety and other mental problems. This seminar will discuss a personal experience of psychiatric illness and recovery, and the redemptive and healing realities of Christian love and the Christian gospel. It is by confronting and sharing our painful vulnerabilities that we discover the profound reality of grace.

John Wyatt is Emeritus Professor of Neonatal Paediatrics at University College London.

### Pressing through pastoral disappointments Chris and Maggie Parsons - Y7

Over time the joy which is so central to our calling can evaporate in the heat of day to day ministry. It's then easy to be thrown off track when things go wrong in our church or ministry area. How can we prevent this happening? This seminar will provide some insights into the way we can approach our calling and help us to become better at pressing through our disappointments. There will also be an opportunity for prayer ministry.

### Isn't Christian morality immoral? James Mumford - Arches

What are the distinctly Christian 'positions' on hotbutton controversial moral issues? And can they only be understood from within the church? Or is there a way of presenting them to a world which is sometimes hostile to Christian faith? This seminar will take up the question of what makes up distinctively Christian ethics from the perspective of what struck pagan outsiders about the early church's practices and beliefs about morality.

Dr James Mumford was educated at Oxford and Yale, has a PhD in moral philosophy and theology. He is married to Holly and his hobbies are Holly, football and the Coen brothers.

#### Revisiting personal growth Lulu Williams - F1

The consequences of sin has touched and affected every aspect of our lives - body, mind, emotions, relationships, as well as spirit. In the busyness and challenges of life, our attention to growing in personal wholeness can take a back seat. In this seminar we shall look at how beliefs affect our behaviour, and how we can take steps to deal with unhelpful thinking. We shall also consider how we can learn to respond more positively to others through our speech and interactions as we grow in the fruit of self-control.

Lulu with her husband Rick planted the Riverside Vineyard in 1988. In 2011 they transitioned the leadership of Riverside to take up the role of Associate National Directors, and to lead the National Church Development Team.

# So you want to plant a church? James Rankine - G4

James and his wife Jen love talking about and being involved with church planting. This session will look at and grapple with questions such as; "Why do we plant churches?", "How do churches get planted?" and "How do you explore the idea of church planting?" For the church to have a future, the next generation needs to take the baton and face the challenge that God is looking for future leaders of His church. James, with his wife Jen, leads the Cardiff Vineyard and heads up The Cause to Live For (20's-30's) network for Vineyard Churches across the UK and Ireland.

#### You are the project Andy Smith - Y7

Your calling to lead people is about more than results. We often think the ministry we lead is the project. When in reality, you are the project. In this seminar, we will be talking about how Jesus uses the calling he places upon us to shape us into His likeness.

Andy pastors Belfast City Vineyard together with his wife, Harmony. Andy serves on the church planting task force, and is passionate about seeing many healthy churches planted in Ireland.

#### Forum - Trustees Peter Sturrock and Jeremy Cook - F3

This forum will focus on essential compliance and legal updates affecting churches. There will also be plenty of opportunity for questions.

Jeremy and Peter serve Vineyard Churches as trustees, Jeremy is chairman and treasurer, Peter is secretary and legal adviser, and both are senior pastors of churches, Hull Vineyard and Aberdeen Vineyard respectively.

#### Compassion and The Arches Helen Murphy and Team - Arches

"Our responsibility to the poor was etched into our spirits right from the beginning as the Lord made it a personal issue with us in the Vineyard." (John Wimber) In this seminar Helen and team will be sharing about embracing the poor in the New Arches Venue, giving their insight, explaining some of the issues they are grappling with and telling stories of transformation.

As we press the pedal of church planting over the coming years, there is an urgent need to train and equip emerging leaders. Over the past three years VCUKI has developed the Hub training programme. There are seven Hub centres across the UK and Ireland, training more than 250 students; 100 of these are also undertaking theological study. Sooner or later you're going to run out of people. People like you, that is – and the sooner it happens the better. At that crucial moment your church will plateau. It will hesitate at a crossroads. The choice will be simple: do we stay as we are, or do we begin to reach out and disciple the fringe?

Chris and Fliss Lane have been in ministry for over thirty years. They helped pioneer the Vineyard Movement in the UK and founded the St Albans Vineyard nearly 25 years ago.
